3. A statement about your reasons for choosing Baylor College of Law (maximum two pages). You should include any information that assisted you in making that choice. This could include the reputation of Baylor Law School, career aspirations, curricular options, location, etc.
4. A copy of the personal statement you sent with your Baylor Law School application.
5. A copy of your unofficial transcript from Texas A&M from Howdy.tamu.edu. Open the pdf version of your transcript and save it. Do not submit a degree evaluation!
6. A copy of your Academic Summary Report from the LSAC website. You can find this by logging into <http://www.lsac.org> and clicking on "Transcripts" under the Credential Assembly Service section.

To be considered for this scholarship, all requested items must be received in the OPSA office no later than **noon, Tuesday, January 31, 2017**. You may fax, email, mail, or hand-deliver as long as you remember that it is your responsibility to ensure that all parts are received by the deadline. Please-- Do not use 'special' paper or folders or binders as this slows down the review process.

Joseph Milton Nance Presidential Scholarship For Aggies Enrolling at the Baylor College of Law

Baylor Law School will award full-tuition scholarships to two outstanding Texas A&M graduates who are entering Baylor Law School in the Fall 2017 Quarter. The scholarships honor the late Dr. Joseph Milton Nance, who was the pre-law advisor and history professor at Texas A&M. The scholarships are renewable for all three years of study at the law school, providing the student maintains a grade average of 2.0. If you have been offered a different Presidential Scholarship, you are encouraged to apply for the Nance Presidential Scholarship as the minimum grade point average to keep the scholarship is much lower than it is for the other Presidential Scholarships.

The primary criteria for selection of scholarship recipients are:

Scholarship, as evidenced by grades and LSAT scores;
Extracurricular activities and leadership potential;
Genuine desire in pursuing a legal career; and
Personal character.

To be eligible to apply for the scholarship, an applicant must:

Earn a bachelor's degree from Texas A&M and have completed a substantial portion of their degree requirements at Texas A&M;
Have a minimum LSAT score of 160;
Have a minimum grade point average of 3.60 as calculated by LSAC;
Have applied to Baylor Law School for the Fall 2017 quarter.

There are no exceptions on eligibility requirements.

Nominations for the scholarships will be made by Professional School Advising and forwarded to Baylor Law School. The scholarships will be awarded by Baylor, provided the student has been admitted for the Fall Quarter 2017 and complies with all documentation requirements for Baylor Law School.
