

Occupational Therapy (OT)

Occupational Therapy is the only profession that helps people across their lifespan do the things they want/need to do through the therapeutic use of daily activities (occupations). OTs enable people of all ages to live life to its fullest by helping them promote health, and prevent—or live better with—injury, illness, or disability through a holistic perspective. Their focus is on adapting the environment and/or task to fit the patient, and the patient is an integral part of the therapy team.¹

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of OTs is projected to grow 12% from 2022 to 2032. The need for OTs is a result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force. The median annual salary for an OT was \$93,180 in May 2022, with 90% of OTs earning more than \$63,320.²

Prerequisites: Applicants may elect to major in any chosen field; however, there are certain required courses which must be completed prior to admission to school – see second page. Students must complete all required prerequisite courses prior to beginning an OT program. Some programs require all prerequisite courses and/or a certain number of prerequisites be completed prior to applying, so it is important for you to review the admissions requirements on each program’s website.

The OT prerequisite chart is a guide developed in consultation with the TX OT programs to assist you in planning your undergraduate curriculum. Please review the notes above and below the chart carefully and contact the Pre-OT advisor with questions.

Experience: Most TX OT programs require a minimum of 20-80 hours of documented volunteer, observation, or paid work experience with a licensed OT. Programs prefer applicants to have experience in more than one OT setting. Some programs have a form they require applicants fill out, so it is important for you to review the notes under the prerequisite guide and double check each program’s website for more information.³

Additional Information: The GRE® is required for admission to some TX OT programs.⁴ All grades from higher education institutions, including dual credit, count toward your OTCAS GPA. Additional essays, resumes, letter of recommendations and interviews are required by many programs. Once accepted, programs require background checks, immunizations, and CPR for the Healthcare Provider certification before starting. Program length varies depending on it being a master’s or doctoral degree.
