

Physical Therapy (PT)

PT is a dynamic profession with an established theoretical and scientific base and widespread clinical applications in restoring, maintaining, and promoting optimal physical function. Physical therapists diagnose and manage movement dysfunction and enhance physical and functional abilities for their patients. According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics, the job outlook is projected to grow 17% from 2021 to 2031, which is much faster than the average for other occupations.¹ The median annual physical therapist's salary is \$95,620 in May 2021, with 90% earning more than \$61,930.²

Prerequisites: Students must complete all required prerequisite courses before beginning a PT program. Some programs require all prerequisite courses and/or a certain number of prerequisites to be completed before applying, so applicants will need to review the admissions requirements on each program's website.

There are currently 353 PT doctoral programs (DPT). Texas currently has 16 DPT programs, 15 are entry-level programs, and applicants can attend the doctoral program immediately after receiving a bachelor's degree. Texas A&M doesn't have a designated pre-PT major, so students may choose from over 200 major fields of study. Most students select majors which include the prerequisites and provide an alternate career choice. Common majors include Kinesiology, Biology, Health, and Nutrition.

The PT prerequisite chart is a guide developed in consultation with the TX PT programs to assist you in planning your undergraduate curriculum. Please review the notes above and below the chart carefully and contact the Pre-PT advisor with questions.

Experience: While some schools require a minimum of 50 hours of volunteer/work experience in 3 different areas before consideration, at least 200 hours in diverse settings makes for a competitive applicant. On PTCAS, applicants will have the option to submit the licensed physical therapist's contact information and/or upload documentation of their shadowing. Check PT program websites and [PTCAS program directory](#) to see what has been required in the past.

GRE® General Test: The GRE® is required for admission to most TX PT programs and is offered as a computer-delivered test year-round. The GRE® General Test features question types that closely reflect the thinking you'll do — and the skills you need to succeed — in today's demanding graduate and business school programs.

The test covers verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, and analytical writing.³ We recommend you look at the DPT program of your choosing to learn more about what would be considered a competitive score.

ASU Note: Requires ENGL 210 technical writing or a 4.5 on the writing section of GRE and <https://www.angelo.edu/academics/programs/physical-therapy-dpt/admission/>

HSU Note: Applicants must have 5 of 7 Science/Stats prerequisites courses completed before a seat in the class may be offered.

TTUHSC Note: No More than 16 hours of science prerequisite courses may be in process at time of application. See recommended coursework <https://www.ttuhsu.edu/health-professions/doctor-of-physical-therapy/admissions-requirements.aspx>

Additional Information:

All grades from higher education institutions, including dual credit, count toward your PTCAS GPA (competitive is 3.5 and up). An academic review will be done along with your PTCAS application, and having frequent Q-Drops can adversely affect your application. Additional supplemental essays, resumes, and interviews are required by most programs. Once accepted, programs require background checks, immunizations, and CPR for the Healthcare Provider certification before starting.
