1. Scholarship application with no blank spaces.
2. A copy of your resume, including all University honors, awards and extracurricular activities, employment history, group activities and volunteer work.
3. A statement about your reasons for choosing Baylor College of Law (maximum two pages). You should include any information that assisted you in making that choice. This could include the reputation of Baylor Law School, career aspirations, curricular options, location, etc.
4. A copy of the personal statement you sent with your Baylor Law School application.
5. A copy of your unofficial transcript from Texas A&M from [Howdy.tamu.edu](http://www.tamu.edu). Open the pdf version of your transcript and save it. Do not submit a degree evaluation or screenshot!
6. A copy of your Academic Summary Report from the LSAC website. You can find this by logging into <http://www.lsac.org> and clicking on “Transcripts” under the Credential Assembly Service section.

To be considered for this scholarship, all requested items must be received by email no later than **noon, Friday, February 6, 2026.**

## **For Aggies Enrolling at the Baylor College of Law**

Baylor Law School will award full-tuition scholarships to two outstanding Texas A&M graduates who are entering Baylor Law School in the Fall 2026 Quarter. The scholarships honor the late Dr. Joseph Milton Nance, who was the prelaw advisor and history professor at Texas A&M. The scholarships are renewable for all three years of study at the law school, providing the student maintains a grade point average of 1.9. If you have been offered a different Presidential Scholarship, you are encouraged to apply for the Nance Presidential Scholarship as the minimum grade point average to keep the scholarship is much lower than it is for the other Presidential Scholarships.

The primary criteria for selection of scholarship recipients are:

Scholarship, as evidenced by grades and LSAT scores; Extracurricular activities and leadership potential; Genuine desire in pursuing a legal career; and Personal character.

To be eligible to apply for the scholarship, an applicant must:

Earn a bachelor's degree from Texas A&M and have completed a substantial portion of their degree requirements at Texas A&M;  
Have a minimum LSAT score of 167;  
Have a minimum grade point average of 3.7 as calculated by LSAC;  
Have applied to Baylor Law School for the Fall 2026 quarter.

There are no exceptions on eligibility requirements.

Nominations for the scholarships will be made by the Professional School Advising committee and forwarded to Baylor Law School. **You will only be notified if you receive the scholarship.** The scholarships will be awarded by Baylor, provided the student has been admitted for the Fall Quarter 2026 and complies with all documentation requirements for Baylor Law School.
